Code switching (also code-switching, CS) is the practice of moving back and forth between two languages or between two dialects or registers of the same language at one time. Code switching occurs far more often in conversation than in writing. It is also called code-mixing and style-shifting.

Code Switching Definition and Examples in Language

Introduction. This chapter describes the place of CS in language contact, including its relationship with borrowing, pidginization, convergence and language shift. All of these are instances of change, but the time-scale in which such change occurs can vary widely. CS occurs in contact situations of many types and relates in complex ways to the processes of change at work in those situations.

Although code switching is of course by definition a consequence of and reflection of language contact, rela- tively little attention seems to have been paid to the question of how switching is affected by the nature of the contact between a particular pair of languages, or, to put it the other way round, of what patterns of switching may reveal about the rela- tions holding between the languages in a contact situation.

In the current state of language-contact research, code-switching (CS) studies have been mainly concerned with clearly separated, often typologically distant, pairs of languages. One question that has been insufficiently explored is whether both syntactic models and pragmatic functional models which are intended to account for code-switching patterns can straightforwardly be applied to situations where the languages in contact are the standard language and a genetically related dialect.

Sociolinguists, social psychologists, and identity researchers are interested in the ways in which code-switching, particularly by members of minority ethnic groups, is used to shape and maintain a sense of identity and a sense of belonging to a larger community.

Allow students to code switch when they have difficulty continuing a conversation in the target language. Allowing code switching as a bridge between familiar and unfamiliar vocabulary often helps students get more comfortable conversing spontaneously in the target language.

Code switching can be defined as the use of two or more linguistic varieties in the same conversation. Crystal (1987) suggests that code switching or language switching occurs when two bilingual individuals alternates two languages during their speech between them. This kind of language alternation happens generally amongst bilinguals.
